BALSAM FIR PEST DAMAGES TREES IN NEW BRUNSWICK
Special to The Standard.
Fredericton, Sept. 7.—Half of the balsam fir in New Brunswick has been destroyed by a pest this year according to a report brought to the city by Prof. S. A. Graham of the University of Minnesota, and Prof. J. D. Tohill, of the Dominion Entomological Bureau, who have returned after taking a trip of 125 miles through the crown timber lands of the province in company with L. S. Webb, of the forest service on an investigation of the destruction by the pest.
They entered the woods about a week ago at Red Bank, near Newcastle, and then went to the head waters of the Little South West Miramichi, and then came south across the Rouens and out of the woods at Dolosstown. The trip was made on foot, and practically all of the balsam fir which is very plentiful in that district, has been destroyed by the spruce bug worm. In some areas where the pest was thicker than in others, it attacked the spruce and not the balsam. The damage to spruce had been quite serious.
"Nothing can be done to exterminate the pest except to remove the large quantities of balsam fir which are grown in certain districts in New Brunswick," declared Prof. Graham, who has just come from Quebec where much damage was done, and left Saturday night for Ottawa. He has been employed by the Dominion government this summer to investigate the pest throughout Canada.

BALSAM FIR PEST DAMAGES TREES IN NEW BRUNSWICK
