Call on Workers to Seize Factories and Operate Them for Selves.

Berlin, Now. 17—German communists are preaching a new strategy in the warfare between labor and capital. They are now calling upon the proletariat workmen not to strike but to seize the factories and insist upon the right to work full time. The Communist Red Flag today issues as new motto for revolutionary workmen "move into the factories; reopen idle plants, restore full time in shops working short time—all under the supervision of shop councils."

An imposing new policy of action was predicted at the Communist convention last week against employers who take advantage of the industrial depression to close their factories on the stightest provocation, thereby dulling the edge of the revolutionary strike weapon. This call for the organization of shop councils for the communist contract of production and the expulsion of factory owners who do not provide full time employment for their workers, is a result. The Communists warn against isolated action, pointing out that employees of individual plants trying to follow the above tactles are quickly suppresed.
