PRISONERS WANTED ADMITTANCE, BUT COULDN'T EVEN BREAK INTO THE JAIL.

Sheriff Foster Arrives from Woodstock With Two Men for
Dorchester, and Substitute Turnkey at the Big Stone
Building Refuses to Take Them for the Night.

Sheriff Foster, of Carleton county, must think St. John's jail has become an exclusive place since it has been all fixed up, for Thursday night admission was refused two prisoners whom he wanted to place there for the night.

There was a new man on the turnkey's job, and this was the reason, for he didn't want to assume the responsibility of taking in the prisoners as he had not encountered just such a situation before and was doubtful if he would be doing right in taking them under his charge.

Finally a roosting place was found for them in one of the cells at the central police station.

The prisoners are William Hopkins, single, Florenceville, Carleton county, and Bart Danford, married, of Brackley, Carleton county. Their offense was breaking into the C. P. R. station at East Florenceville on August 22, and stealing three cases of whisky. Sheriff Foster ran down these men on the charge and they pleaded guilty when brought before Justice Dibble at Woodstock.

Two years imprisonment in Dorchester penitentiary was their sentence, and last night the sheriff arrived in the 11 o'clock train with his men, handcuffed together, en route to the Dorchester institution to begin their season of captivity.

The sheriff drove with his prisoners to the county jail in King street (East), intending to put them up there for the night (as he often had done before), and leave with them for Dorchester in the morning.

He pounded for a while on the jail door, but met with no response. Then he took his men into the guard room of central police station in the next building, and asked Policeman Isaac Baxter to get communication with the jail through the yard between the two buildings. Baxter did so and the sheriff and prisoners entered the jail through the rear door.

But they didn't stay, for the turnkey said he was only on duty temporarily while the regular man was on holidays, and he didn't think he should shoulder the responsibility, notwithstanding that the sheriff was a little nettled at this time, but that didn't make things any better and there was a dead-lock, which finally was relieved by Baxter, who said he would place the men in a police station cell. The turnkey shut himself in again, the prisoners were taken back to central and the incident was closed.

BIG OUTPUT OF CAPE BRETON MINES.

288,288 Tons in August—More
Than 300,000 in September Ex-
pected.

Glouce Bay, C. B., Sept. 3.—The monthly output of the six collieries operated by the Dominion Coal Company for August was 288,288 tons. This is slightly less than that of July, when the output was 308,190, but this may be accounted for by the fact that during August there were two working days less than during July. By comparing the figures for actual working days it will be seen that the output per working day during August was greater than that during July. The output for September barring unforeseen occurrences will be considerably in excess of 300,000 tons. July output was 315,000 tons, the highest in the history of the company's operations and August was a close second. The August output from the various collieries was:

Torpedo Mail Boats

In Norway torpedo boats are now carrying the mail between Christiania and Bergen. The naval authorities have long been anxious to increase the efficiency of the officers and men on board of these boats as much as possible, and they finally decided that this object could best be achieved, by letting the boats run regularly between the two greatest cities in the country.

For three reasons this plan was preferred to any other. First, because during the trip the boats could be thoroughly tested; second, because the officers could become fully acquainted with that portion of the Norwegian coast; and third, because the postal service would be benefited.

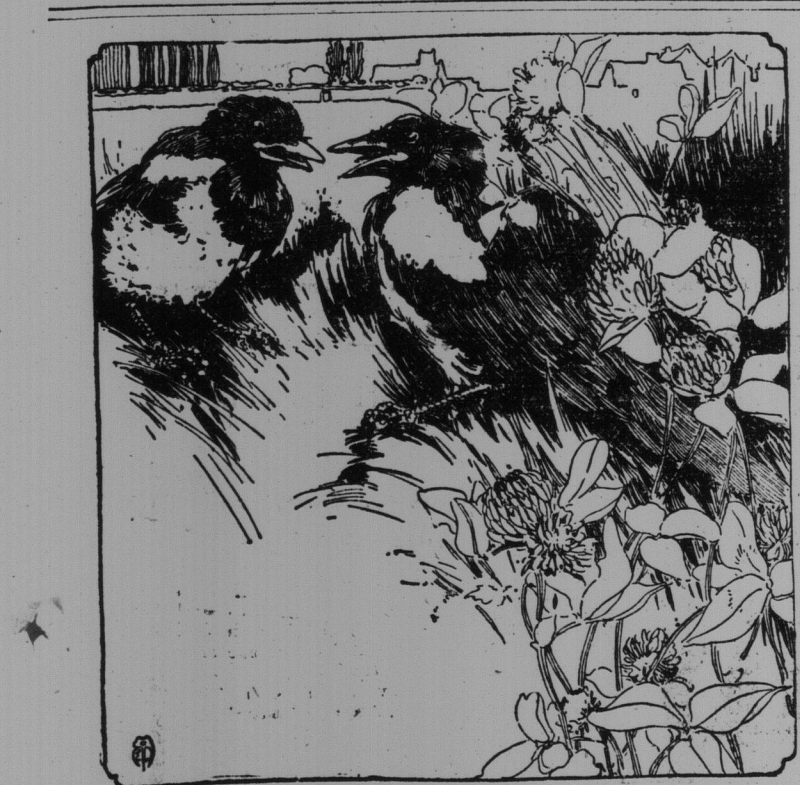
There is no railway connection between Bergen and Christiania, and all postal communications between the two cities are delivered by boat. In doing this work the torpedo boats far excel the ordinary mail steamers.

GLAD TO GET ANYWHERE.

LATE VISITORS HAVE TROUBLE GET-
TING LODGINGS.

But Find the Exhibition Bureau on Market
Square a Great Help—Midnight Party
of Ladies on Bank of Montreal Steps.

As shown by the reports from the exhibition the attendance this year is unprecedented. The lodging bureau on the corner of King and Prince William streets has its capacity fully taxed daily and nightly. This institution is greatly appreciated by the visitors. It is in charge of Fred James with Charles Welsh and J. C. Leonard assisting him and is open day and night.

Wednesday night these officials told The Telegraph that with the exception of a few private houses in downtown the city was full and that they were sending visitors to Carleton for lodgings.

Between the hours of 6 and 8 o'clock Wednesday evening 300 people were accommodated. There were more outside visitors in town Wednesday than on any other day and they are still coming. A few people arriving at the eleventh hour Tuesday night could not be accommodated and walked the streets through the midnight hours, while a large number slept in the lodging bureau. Tuesday evening a party of 15 people came to the bureau and had to be sent to seven places before they could be accommodated. Many of the visitors have remarked that these arrangements for finding them lodgings were the most accommodating of any place they had seen at any exhibition in the maritime provinces.

Wednesday the bureau was the scene of many more late visitors. Considerable difficulty was experienced in disposing of some. Twelve persons slept on mattresses in the bureau and were glad of the opportunity.

A large number of people arrived from Houston (Me.) last Wednesday on the late express and gave the bureau officials some work in finding lodgings. Nearly all the places in the city are filled with the exception of some in Carleton which can accommodate many more, but people object to going so far.

At an early hour Thursday morning several ladies were noticed sitting on the steps of the C. P. R. offices on King street with their baggage piled about them.

NEW TELEPHONE LINE.

Communication Between Kingston
and St. John—Macdonald School
Evidently Having Good Results.

A movement is on foot in Kingston and vicinity to secure telephone communication with St. John and other places. This may be done by either connecting with the main line near Jubilee Station, or by erecting a new line from Perry's Point to Hampton. More than \$100 has already been subscribed for the purpose and more can be secured if necessary.

VISITING OLD HOME.

Henry Berryman in St. John
on Visit from Central
America.

LAST HERE 20 YEARS AGO.

Brother of Dr. D. E. Berryman
Talks Entertainingly of Civil, Com-
mercial and Political Life in His
Adopted Home—Opportunity for
Foreign Capital There.

Henry Berryman, of Minas de Oro, Honduras, Central America, old St. John boy, is at present visiting his sister, Mrs. Prescott, of Coburg street. A brother is D. E. Berryman, M. D., of this city.

Ten years less than half a century ago Mr. Berryman left St. John and since that time has lived in many climes.

Twice only has he been in St. John since he first left, and 20 years have elapsed since his last visit.

Mr. Berryman told The Telegraph many things of interest. He saw a few changes in the city since his last visit, which, however, was after the fire. Particularly he was impressed with its beautiful suburban roads. He did not know of any other city of the same size and population that had such beautiful scenery or such good roads as St. John. He noticed the greater change in the faces of old friends who have grown from boyshood to manhood, since he left them 20 years ago.

Speaking of his adopted home, Mr. Berryman said that Central America, especially in the part where he was settled, offered admirable inducements to foreign capital. The people and the government were desirous of having these Gringos (foreigners) come into their country with their money and brains. Young men could take advantage of great opportunities in Central America and start on smaller capital on the road to success and wealth than in probably any other country in the world.

There was a delightful in the republic of Honduras, the temperature annual average being from 60 to 80 degrees. The revolution among the natives never injured or interfered with Gringo interests. They were caused generally by certain politicians who in their greed for position and money, oppressed the people until in anger they rebelled. A short while ago Mr. Berryman received a letter from his brother-in-law, Mr. D. E. Berryman, who is now in Honduras, and in the letter it was stated that the republic of Honduras was even now apprehending a revolution. In Central America, however, those descended from Spanish-Carib blood being the best and often as white as Europeans.

Mr. Berryman owns a small estate of half a square mile or more and finds the climate and coffee raising extremely lucrative and enjoyable. He also owns and operates a very comfortable place gold mine, situated close to the United States, Central America and Germany.

One law that is of interest and which is enforced throughout the whole of the republic of Honduras is that of compulsory education. All children between 8 and 14 years of age must attend school.

Mr. Berryman will remain in two weeks in America via New Orleans in two weeks. He has, he says, enjoyed every moment of his visit.
