council activities will have a further \$8,000 over expenditure before the end of April in several areas.

On a more optimistic note, Campus Activites and Student Services are expected to be some \$9,100 under origiaccording to a report tabled this week nal estimates.

SU publications such as the Consumers Guide, Student Directory, Handbook and Yearbook will finish some \$4,600 under budget.

Clubs and societies, cultural groups and special interest groups are expected to save the union \$10,000.

Other items including the reserve and contingency fund should contain \$6,700 at the end of April. The student media should be about on budget.

Interest Revenue from SU investments and the Health Plan should bring in \$15,000, about what was expected.

Council began the year last May with an overall surplus of \$60,000 but the estimated budget deficit and loans to the new student owned and operated pub The Cellar, totalling \$41,000, have by some \$10,000. Items purchased that were not included in the original budget caused nearly all that to disappear.

"The deficit is no surprise to me and should be no surprise to Council," Pinet said. "Council authorized the over-expenditure for various reasons."

"We'll have to be more accountable and Pinet estimates the office budget and more financially responsible next year."


