THE DEPUTY HEADS AND CHIEF OFFICERS OF DEPARTMENTS.

Clerk of the Queen's Privy Council.—WILLIAM ALFRED HIMSWORTH. B. 28 Augt., 1820. Served as clerk in the Commissariat, 1838 to 1842. Called to the Bar in L.C. 1841. Clerk in Leg. Assembly, Canada, 1842-43. Apptd. in Executive Council office, 1843, and assistant Clerk of the Council, 1851. Sworn in as Clerk of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada on 1st of July, 1872. Was Secretary to the "Confederate Council on Commercial Treaties" which sat at Quebec, 1864-65. Deputy Governor for signing money warrants. Commissioner *Dedimus Potestatem*, and a Commissioner in the Queen's Bench for Ontario. (Salary \$2,600.) *Daly Street; Eastern Departmental Building.*
