The Honorable Mr. McDonald presented to the House the following notice for a

Bill of Divorce :---

NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given, that application will be made to the Parliament of Canada, at the next Session thereof, by Martha Jemima Hawkshaw Holiwell, of the City of Toronto, in the County of York, and Province of Ontario, married woman, for a Divorce from Charles Edwin Holiwell, of the City of Quebec, in the Province of Quebec, Army Stationer, her husband, on the ground of adultery.

Dated at the City of Toronto, this 23rd day of June, 1876.

MARTHA JEMIMA HAWKSHAW HOLIWELL.

Then William Frederick Powell, of the City of Ottawa, Sheriff of the County of Carleton, was called to the Bar of the House, and being sworn, was examined as follows:—

What is your name, place of residence and profession or occupation?—William Frederick Powell, of the city of Ottawa, in the County of Carleton and Province of

Ontario, Sheriff of said County.

Do you know Charles Edwin Holiwell, of the City of Quebec, in the Province of Quebec, Army Stationer, the Respondent to the Petition of his wife, Martha Jemima Hawkshaw Holiwell, of the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario, for an Act of Parliament for a Divorce from him,—and if so, how long have you known him?

I know him, and have known him for a period of about fifteen years.

Look on this paper marked "A," did you serve a copy of the same on Charles Edwin Holiwell; and it so, at what time, in what place and under what circumstances? I served a copy of the notice now shewn to me marked "A," on the Twenty-second day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, upon the said Charles Edwin Holiwell, by delivering the same to and leaving the same with him at his place of business in the City of Quebec, in the Province of Quebec,—such copy of said notice being in writing and bearing the proper signature in full of the said Martha Jemima Hawkshaw Holiwell. I at the same time told the said Charles Edwin Holiwell that the notice was a notice of application for divorce on the part of his wife, Martha Jemima Hawkshaw Holiwell, and that it was served by me at the instance and request of his said wife, and I read the same to him. I then said, "you are the husband of Martha Jemima Hawkshaw Holiwell?" he replied, "Yes;" and said, "This is all rot. I expected this, and am prepared for it. I did leave her, and everybody says I should have done it long ago. I should have done it ten years sooner. I have got the start of her."

The said William Frederick Powell was directed to withdraw.
