And be it enacted, That notwithstanding the The Legisla-35 privileges that may be conferred by this Act, the Legis-ture may at any time hereafter in their discretion and so as to protect without its being deemed any infringment of such privileges, the public, &c. make such additions to this Act, or such alterations of any of its provisions, as they may think proper for affording just 40 protection to the public; or for protecting any person or persons, body corporate or politic, in respect to their estate, property or right or any interest therein, or any advantage, privilege or convenience connected therewith, or in respect to any way or right of way, public or private, that 45 may be affected by any of the powers given to any such Corporation.
