to provide four months alternative service for the Mennonites, Doukhobors and Conscientious Objectors in the 21 year old class, who are exempt from military service, and to continue this same policy with a further appropriated expenditure as other classes are called out?

(2) Should we confine work to be done to work which would otherwise not be done and should we, in the main, restrict our activities to work in National Parks, deviating therefrom in such provinces where the provincial government desires to co-operate in some road construction project?

I have a full and detailed report from the Parks Branch of the actual work which would be done by these men in every park but you will not be concerned with this detail. The decision on the policy principles will be sufficient for us to proceed.
