Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Belgian Government, for budget reasons, have decided to abolish the Belgian career Consulate at Montreal and, at the same time, transfer the seat of the Belgian Consulate General in Canada, Newfoundland and Bermuda from Ottawa to Montreal; in the latter city reside about seven thousand Belgian citizens, whereas in Ottawa, as far as I am aware, there are not over fifty.

I anticipate the transfer of this Consulate General to Montreal will be completed by the first of August next.

I should feel much obliged if you would kindly let me know whether it would be quite convenient for you to receive me in the course of this or next week and, if so, to advise me of the date and time.
