

Dear Mr. McKenna,-

In reply to your enquiry I beg to inform you that both Mr. Inspector McColl and Mr. Inspector Leveque will require a clerk ~~xxxx~~ to assist them in making annuity payments during the coming summer. The Rev. Mr. Semmens will also need a clerical assistant. If Mr. Swinford accompanies Mr. Inspector Marlatt as he did last year the latter will not require a clerk.

Last year Mr. Inspector Leveque's son acted as his father's clerk and was paid \$2.00 a day for 84 days. Mr. J. P. Wadge was employed as Mr. Semmens clerk for 66 days at \$2.00 per day and Mr. McColl's son accompanied him as clerk 87 days at \$2.00 a day.
