Sir:

Referring to your letter of the 29th March last, with reference to the admission of the two children of Louis Anglin, No. 387, of the St. Regis Band to a Roman Catholic boarding school, and the Department's reply thereto of the 1st April, I beg to say that there will be two vacancies in the Province of Quebec in the Windsong Industrial School this Autumn.

I am sending you two forms of application which be good enough to fill out, and have the children examined by the doctor, and forward the applications to the Department with as little delay as possible.

It is expected that a number of children will be going up to Cashinewaga and arrangements can be made to have these two children brought from St. Regis and sent on with the others.
