REPLY TO THE PROSECUTIONS REBUTTAL ON SUBMISSION OF THE DEFENCE TO HAVE THIRD CHARGE, CASE OF A23406 PTE JONES, R. ., DISMISSED.

The Frosecution claims that evidence that the accused was found with a few of the articles reported as stolen, is evidence that Pte Jones stole them. It has been established that, one ladies tailored suit was found on the street, turned into the offices of the MP, identified by Mde Beyst and returned to her with the other articles. This man did not steal anything.
