A. No, I did not.

D.129855 Spr. (A/L/Cpl.) MCNIQUE, C., No 1 C.E.RU., a soldier of the Canadian Army (Overseas), having been duly sworn, states:-

Between 2200 and 2215 hrs 29 Sep 44, I was welking down Minley Road, between the "Crown and Cushion" Hotel, and the cump entrance. I was walking with Spr. Wanford and another soldier. I was in the centre, but we were all on the right side of the road. I could see some people welking about 100 feet shead of us, going in the same direction as we were, and on the same side of the road.

I heard the noise of a vehicle behind me and turned around. I sew two lights of a car approaching, so I grabbed Manford andthe other soldier with me, and pulled them further to the side of the road. The vehicle went past very close to us, and I saw it hit someone amongst the people walking shead of us. Immediately it hit this person, the vehicle swerved further to the right, and then back to the centre of the read. The vehicle seemed to slow down for a second after it hit the person, and then kept on going. I saw the vehicle turn in at the camp gate. I went to the person who had been hit, and figured that he was in pretty bad shape, so immediately went to the guard room and reported the accident.

Q. Could you recognize anyone in the vehicle?

A? 50, sir.
