Re: Domestic Water Supply Chekwelp Indian Reserve No. 26.

Chekwelp Indian Reserve is situated along the waterfront between Gibson's Landing and Granthem's Landing on Howe Sound, and the domestic water supply is obtained from Soames Creek at Grantham's Landing. The water is pumped by means of an hydraulic ram, from the creek to a 5,000-gallon storage tank situated just inside the north boundary of the reserve.

As will be seen from the plans of this pipeline prepared by W.C. McElhanney, and dated May 11, 1945, the water main passes from the highway across the S.E. quarter of Lot D, then across the N.W. quarter of Lot E, then across the road allowance and to the storage tank on the reserve. To obviate the necessity of crossing private property it is proposed to relocate this part of the pipeline.

Lots D and E are each 60' x 120' and slope steeply down from west to east. They are bounded on the north, east, and west by road allowances and on the south by the reserve. It is now planned to relocate the pipeline east along the road allowance north of Lot D, thence south along the road allowance

The cost of this work is estimated at \$246.000 letails of which are shown in Appendix "A".
