

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mottier, if the father is deceased) of the home-cader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for be requirements as to residence may be estimated by such person re-ding with the father or mother. the re-

(3) If a sottler was entitian to and has obtained entry for a secon homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain ing patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead. I the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (8) or (4) must cultivate 30 acress of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers aly who completed the duries upon their first homestends to entitle hem to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the omestend law is liable to are his entry cancelled, and the land may e again thrown open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

hould be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-gent, or the Homestead Igspector. Before making application for atent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-issioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawaw, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION.

INFORMATION, Newly arrived immigration office in Municoba or the North-West Territories, information as to be lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing land to suit theur Full Information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral law, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Beit in British Columbia, may be obtained upon applica-tion to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winninge, Manttoha, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
