

And Mr. *Dessaullles* reported, that the Committee had come to a Resolution, which he was directed to submit to the House, whenever it shall be pleased to receive the same.

ORDERED, That the Report be received on Friday next.

Mr. *Panet*, from the Committee of the whole House, to whom was referred that part of the Speech of His Excellency the Governor in Chief, relating to Internal Communications, reported, according to order, the Resolution of the said Committee ; and he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's Table, where the said Resolution was again read, and is as followeth :

RESOLVED, As the opinion of this Committee, that it is necessary to make provision for the improvement of the Internal Communications of this Province.

On motion of Mr. *Vézina*, seconded by Mr. *Ogden*,

ORDERED, That the question of concurrence be now put upon the said Resolution.

Accordingly, the said Resolution was again read, and the question of concurrence being put thereon, it was agreed to unanimously, and

RESOLVED, That this House doth concur with the Committee of the whole House, in the said Resolution.

Mr. *Vézina* moved, seconded by Mr. *Gugy*, that a Committee of seven Members be appointed, to enquire what Internal Communications are most essential, and merit the earliest attention, and of the probable expense that will attend carrying them into effect, to report from time to time, by Bill or otherwise, and with power to send for persons, papers and records.

Mr. *Borgia* moved, in amendment, seconded by Mr. *Gauvreau*, to leave out the words " from time to time."
