## How Ed. Huck was Killed.

The following is a letter received by Signaller Norman (Squee) Huck, now at he front, announcing the killing in ection of his brother, Edward, who was orn and raised in Walkerton and later noved to Atwood and then to Vancouver where he enlisted:

Corp. Ed. Huck was killed Oct. 20th ust prior to the successful operation which secured us a portion of Regina trench. On the evening of the 18th the Batt, had been ordered into the front ine, but weather conditions were so bad that the intended assault was postponed. Three companies of the 102nd were with Irawn, but "A" Co'y, of which your brother was a member, left to lead the ine. On the 20th, while your brother was carrying on his duties in the trench, a high explosive shell burst close to him. He died from concussion. There was no wound on his body, death was almost instantaneous. From all accounts given by men who saw what happened he suffered no pain. He was buried later just outside the trench


