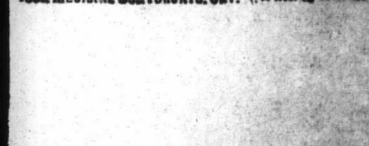

Flagman Failed And Twenty-One Lives Were Lost In Big Wreck

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Sept. 3.—The aftermath of the Wallingford wreck on the New York, New Haven & Hartford found the death list standing at twenty-one to-day, the largest number of lives lost in any one accident on the railroad since the collision which played the heavy parts in the tragedy under detention by the coroner's order and the machinery for the usual county, state and federal investigations in motion.

NEW SIDEWALK TO BE BUILT ANYWAY

Notwithstanding Protests, the Contract is Awarded.

After considerable squabbling among the residents of Echo Place over the building of a sidewalk on the north side of the Hamilton Road from Stanley St. to where the tracks of the Brantford and Hamilton Radial crosses, the walk is to be laid this fall.

Grand Trunk Abandons Holmedale Switch Plan

The Grand Trunk has decided not to construct the Holmedale switch. For three years announcements have been made from time to time that the company was about to begin work. An agreement was made in 1910, giving the company until this year to make good.

The Holmedale switch route was planned through the rear of the O. I. B. grounds, this concession having been secured from the Ontario Government. Ever since the city gave a big bonus to the G.T.R. for the main line, Holmedale residents felt entitled to secure railway facilities. A satisfactory route could not be agreed upon, however, the city being held up for several years by the Grand Trunk.

EVERYBODY EXPECTANT TO-DAY IN THAW CASE AT SHERBROOKE

Lawyers Alert Waiting for the Next Move on Legal Chess Board---Jerome Talks to "Gentleman Roger," Promising Him Immunity---Latest Developments In Thaw's Great Fight For Freedom.

[Canadian Press Despatch] SHERBROOKE, Que., Sept. 3.—If "Gentleman Roger" Thompson, who drove Harry K. Thaw away from Mattawan cars to tell his story, even at this late day, William Travers Jerome is ready to do what he can to quash the indictment for conspiracy returned against Thompson in Duchesne county.

Sherbrooke, Que., Sept. 3—Thaw loses: writ sustained.

[Canadian Press Despatch] SHERBROOKE, Que., Sept. 3.—Thaw was sent for shortly after two o'clock. This indicated that the decision would soon be announced.

Everybody in Sherbrooke was expectant this afternoon awaiting for Judge Hutchinson's decision on the writ of habeas corpus by which Jerome hopes to force Thaw out of jail into the hands of the immigration authorities for deportation.

SAW THEIR SON'S FATAL FALL

He Promised to Leave Aviation After His Fatal Flight.

Dyer Spellman, who was a passenger with Aviator George Schmidt, when the latter's aeroplane plunged to earth at the Rutland fair yesterday, killing the pilot, is practically assured of recovery, physicians at the Rutland hospital said to-day.

POSTMASTERS WANT INCREASE IN SALARY

Find Cost of Living Going up and Some of Fees Cut Off

UNKNOW MAN KILLED

TORONTO, Sept. 3.—Crushed beyond recognition, the body of a man, possibly 40 years of age, was picked up by the crew of a passing freight train at the foot of Strachan avenue at 4.15 this morning and conveyed to the Union station and later to the morgue. It is supposed he was walking along the tracks and was struck by another train. When found beside the tracks, the body was lying completely severed, one arm torn off and the face and head badly crushed.

The job is, perhaps, the most important one in the construction of the entire line, as it was this part of the route which required a special session of the Dominion Railway Board in this city.

UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE IN THE CITY OF CALGARY

Council Insists That Men and Women be Able to Read.

[Canadian Press Despatch] CALGARY, Alb., Sept. 3.—The city council has adopted an amendment to the city charter, which will put into force in Calgary universal suffrage, the only qualification being that every voter, male or female, must be able to read the second reader in use in the schools of Alberta. The amendment had back of it practically every organization of women in the city.

TURKEY SECURES A BRITISH SHIP

One of Most Formidable in the World Launched To-day.

[Canadian Press Despatch] BARROW IN FURNESS, Eng., Sept. 3.—One of the most formidable battleships in the world, the Reshad-i-Hamis, was launched here to-day as the first unit in the rejuvenated Turkish navy. She displaces over 23,000 tons, and possesses an armament of ten 13.5 inch guns, thus exceeding in gun power any vessel in commission in the British navy. Her contract calls for a speed of 21 knots an hour, and her turbine engines are expected to develop 31,000 indicated horsepower.
