LORD KITCHENER TOOK SERIOUS VIEW OF LIFE

Had No Time for Folly or Pleasures—Was True Christian.

Rev. J. H. Holesworth, late incumbent of All Saints', Cairo, writes as follows on Lord Kitchener's religion.

"No one could be long in his company without realizing that he was a man who viewed life seriously. I may illustrate this from the effect he produced on society in Cairo, when he went there to take up his position as British Agent and Consul-General. Cosmopolitan places like the capital of Egypt, which are largely the haunts of pleasure, are often given over to a frivolity which is not seen in cities of commerce and business. There is frequently a relaxing of moral habits, what is witnessed elsewhere, and a general air of undisciplined, and it goes without saying, that in such places Sunday and Sunday worship are at a discount. It was not for nothing to assert that Cairo was free from these vices. But the coming of Lord Kitchener instantaneously wrought a change. He was known to be a man of unswerving devotion to duty, of disciplined life, of resolute purpose. Instinctively we all braced ourselves up, and it was as though a tonic had been administered to the place. So far as his work permitted, Lord Kitchener was regular and punctual in his church attendance and this at once did beneficially upon the Sunday habits of the community. "He was president of All Saints' Church committee, and I never remember his omitting to take the chair, even when hard pressed by State business."

Lord Kitchener was indeed a type of that simple, manly, straightforward Christianity which we associate with the best English laity, which does not trouble itself indeed about subtle questions and controversies, but rests on the broad facts of revelation, and in simplicity practices its tenets."

REFUGEES FROM ATHENS IN A Boat Was Shelled When Leaving Over to Bandits

By Courier-Lessed Wire.
Athens, Sept. 13, via London, 15 (delayed).—The Margaret, a boat in which Baron Von Schönerer, head of the German propaganda office in Greece, was sent to Kavala, turned over to the Bulgarians, arrived this afternoon with 1000 refugees who were in the most pitiful condition. They had been with food since Sunday, and were packed in the ship like sardines. The fugitives said that a German aeroplane had dropped three bombs as the boat was leaving Kavala, which was within inches of striking the ship. An eye-witness who described the entry of the Bulgarians into Kavala on Monday, said that three German regiments which had remained in town were given until ten o'clock Tuesday morning to surrender prisoners of war. At the expiration of this ultimatum they gave up.

GERMANS LOST 120 PLANES IN MONTENEGRO

Against only Half that Number by French—England Wonderful Army.
By Courier-Lessed Wire.
New York, Sept. 15.—Paul Cravath, attorney, who returned from the Krontland from a six weeks' visit to France and England, said tonight that during August the Germans lost 120 aeroplanes as against 60 lost to the French. "I return home with all doubts moved as to the ultimate victory of the allies," he said. "I now find the slightest uncertainty in the word 'and' and 'an' and that the opinion has become general in the neutral countries in Europe, even those having pro-German sympathies."

THESE GREEN Forming the Fourth A Corps.

Berlin, Sept. 15.—The 4th army corps, with headquarters at Salonika, has been placed in the hands of the Germans by the mander and the troops will be transported to Germany. They will enjoy German hospitality until the soil is freed of allied invaders to the Bulgarians.
