THE TRACK

THE KING'S PLATE. Toronto, Ont., May 21.-Never in the history of the famous Canadian classic has there been so much interest in the race and doubt as to winner. The fact that the record for the race of 2.13, held by Ferdinand from 1897, was lowered a second one.

Fourteen starters faced the barrier, with War Whoop and the Dymen stable as split favorites. The Hendrie entry was 3 to 1. Seagram's entry was 10 to 1, and the Beck entry 15 to 1, the latter opening at 12 to 1. Ten minutes was spent at the post before the barrier went up. They were off to a good start.

Virtuose showed the way, with Golden crest and Con Amore second and third. Hawkins and Grand Lodge, the Beck entry, were tenth and eleventh. Songer made a move on Grand Lodge and went up to sixth place, but Hawkins was still tenth at the quarter.

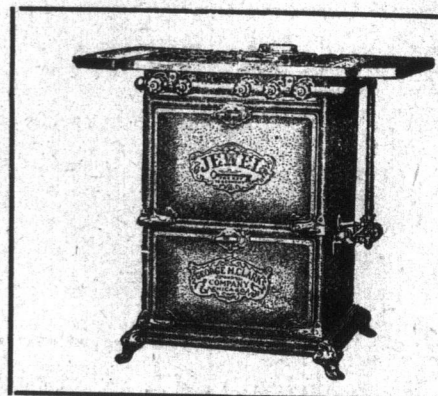
