KINGSTON, JAMAICA, Nov. 10. Great exitement prevails in Kingston over the capture of the steamer Virginius, which left this island with consular and custom house clearances for Limon Bay, Costa Rica. So far as it is actually known in Jamaica the circumstances and locality of the Virginius's surrender are not known as no telegrams to or from this to Santiago relating to this subject have been ago relating to this subject have been permitted to pass out of the telegraph office there. We only know from telegram from the governor of Santiago addressed to the Spanish consulat Kingston that the Virginius had been captured on the 3lst October, and on the 5th the leaders of the expedition—Ryan, Del Sol, Cespedes, and Veronra—were shot.
