The Quebec Liquor Measure Would Prevent Export

Quebec, Feb. 8.—No liquor will be exported to other parts of Canada from the province of Quebec after May 1, if the new legislation brought down by the provincial government today is accepted by the legislature.

One of the officers who prepared the liquor bill said positively tonight that everything connected with the liquor traffic, including the export, will be in the hands of the commission of five members who will be appointed to administer the act. He said that there would be no export of spirituous liquors to outside points. These liquors will be imported by the commission and sold only in authorized depots in the province in quantities of one bottle at a time.

"The Quebec liquor commission," he said, "will not be a source of supply for other provinces. It will import for the needs of consumers in this province, but positively not for export."

May Export Beer

The same official added that there is nothing that will prevent the export of beer or of wines to outside points, but all such shipments must be made by express or by the railways and must be done publicly.

The bill, the provisions of which have been forecasted in despatches from Quebec for weeks, provides for the entire abolition of the present system of handling liquor in Quebec.

The sale retail of all kinds of liquor will be in the hands of the vendors appointed by the commission. The most drastic regulations will be imposed to prevent bootlegging and other infractions. The government will insure that all liquor sold, whether spirit or wine, will be of the highest quality. Consignments will be sold in sealed bottles.

The bill applies to the whole province, but its provisions shall be suspended in every municipality where the Canada temperance act is in force.

Will Curling Be Revolutionized?

A well-known member of the Caledonian Curling Club of this city, who figured prominently in the Quebec Granite Tourney last week, has discovered that by putting rubber rings around curling stones (granites) much of the objection which curlers using irons have had in the past against the use of granites is done away with.

An experiment was made recently in the Caledonian Curling Club, and it was shown for instance, that where formerly a stone (granite) when touching other stones on the tee, would scatter them like a covey of snipe at the approach of a hunting dog, provided with the rubber bands they acted much like the irons.

It is understood that proper bands have been ordered for the purpose and will be carefully tried out, as their adoption would result in a much increased use of stones, which were the utensils originally used in the name in the old country.
