Communications were read from: The manager of the Sterling Bank of Canada stating there was a money deposit in their bank, to the credit of Charles Raquette, deceased, who had been buried by the Township, and he would pay it to the Township on executing the necessary bond of indemnity to the Bank.

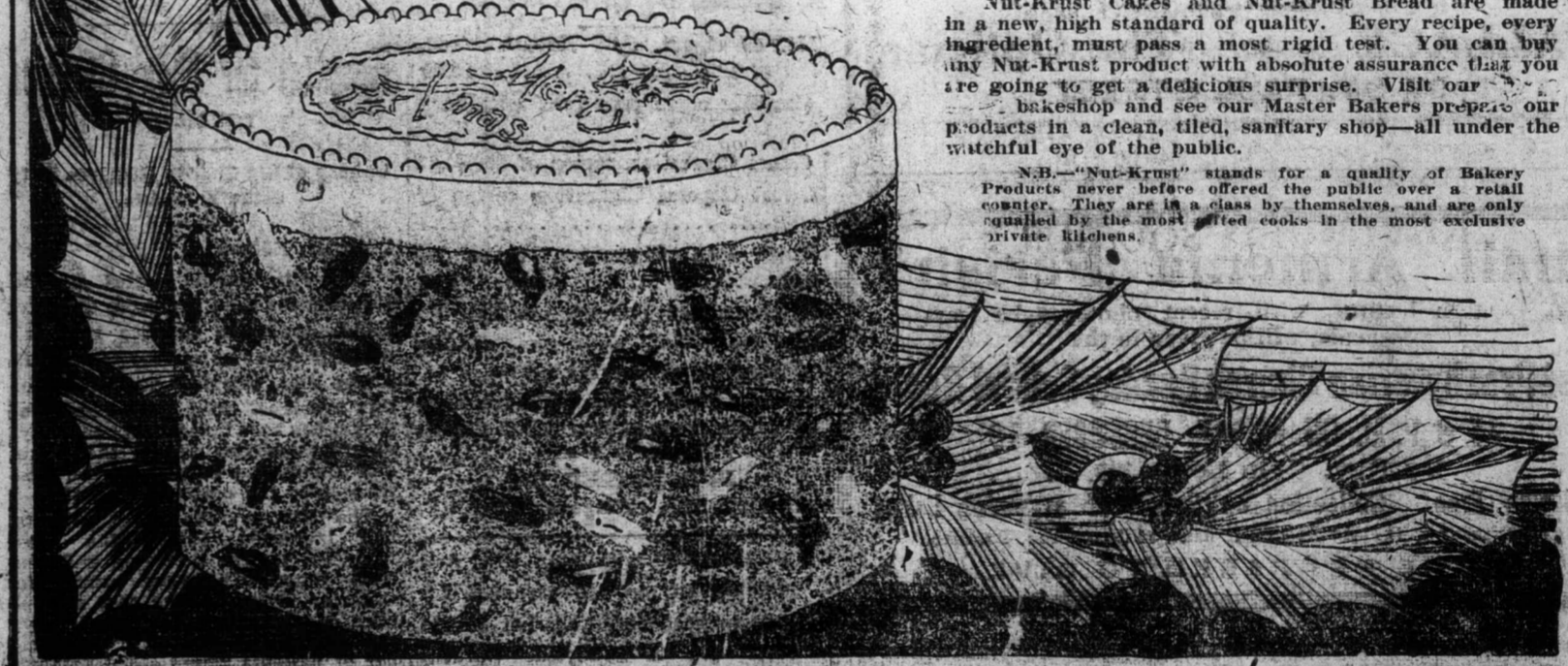
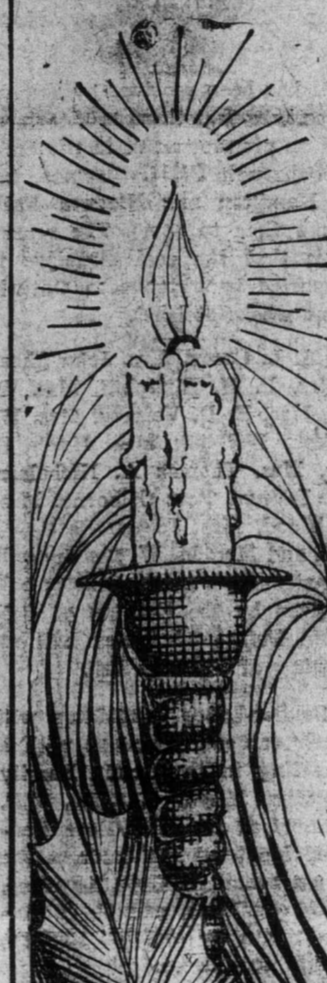

#### MRS GEO. SMITH GIVEN HEARTY WELCOME HOME

Back From Trip to West For I.O.D. E. Memorial.

A hearty welcome was given Mrs. George H. Smith, of this city who is National Educational Secretary, Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire at the meeting of the National Educational Committee held immediately on her arrival in Toronto after a two months' trip in Western Canada. In that time Mrs. Smith travelled more than 7,000 miles, visiting many places in the Provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. In all of these addresses were given on the subject of the War Memorial.

Mrs. Smith spoke enthusiastically of the great interest and enthusiasm displayed everywhere in the War Memorial scheme.
