Household Notes.

Always boil new ironware before using it. In cooking fish make sure that the cleaning is thorough. To move jars of fruit satisfactorily pack them in sawdust. Make baking powder biscuits with water instead of milk. Lined oil will repolish furniture which has become scratched. Wash and dry flannels as quickly as possible if you want them to be soft. Small sweet red peppers are excellent mixed with celery and potato salad. Many people are using paper towels as substitute for the bath towels. Chinese glue is made by dissolving shellac in ten times its weight of ammonia. Sponges, cake and lemon jelly make a tempting dessert at this season of the year. Soak fresh-water fish in water into which a little lemon juice has been squeezed. When baking fish remove the backbone and as many of the side bones as possible. Haddock is one of the most economical fish to purchase, as it contains so little waste or bones. To paint, the bite of a gnat or mosquito with liquid ammonia is perhaps the most effectual remedy. Faded blue hair ribbons may be freshened by allowing them to stand in strong blue water for a few minutes. Many cakes are spoiled by careless guessing at proportions. It is best to use a marked cup and weigh accurately. The white-fleshed fish, such as halibut, cod, flounder and waterfish are more easily digested than other varieties. Cream will not whip satisfactorily if the house is infested with ants dip a sponge into sweetened water. The ants will cluster upon it, and you can drop the sponge, ants and all into hot water. Hang a small bag on the kitchen door and put the wet one's overshoe, cap and gloves in it. He will soon learn to put them away when he comes in from play. Patent leather shoes should be carefully wiped off with a soft cloth when they are removed, and then a few drops of olive oil should be rubbed into them.

Veteran Cook Dead.

There passed away at his home at Montreal on last Sunday morning, May 4th, a well known figure in nautical circles in the person of Charles Agin, cook of the S. S. City of Sydney. Deceased reached the advanced age of 77 years.

City of Sydney Arrives

The s.s. City of Sydney, Capt. McDonald, seven days from Montreal via Gulf ports, arrived at 4.30 yesterday afternoon. She brought a full general cargo, principally flour, and the following passengers in saloon:—J. Whiteley, F. Norman, R. Devlin, R. Derming, W. Strong and eight in steerage. Work of discharging the ship's cargo was continued after last midnight in order to get her away to-day on schedule time.

Have 53 Children.

Remarkable Families of Two Brothers. Paris, May 3.—The brothers Brosseau, of the village of Saint Yauges, it is found, have the record as French fathers. Together they have had fifty-three children. Jean had seventeen boys and one girl by his first wife, and seven boys and five girls by his second wife. Claude had eighteen children, of whom nine came in three sets of triplets; five single children were born to his second wife. Of the first family ten lived, and of the second a dozen. Both the fathers are poor peasants, earning on an average only 15 cents a day, and drawing \$2 yearly from the State as a bounty for raising more than three children to the age of 16.

Chaufeur Convicted

Of Murder by Automobile at Chicago. Chicago, May 3.—Lawrence Lindbloom, a taxicab chauffeur was convicted of murder yesterday in running down and killing Joseph Weiss, it is the first conviction for murder by an automobile in Chicago. He was given 14 years. On August 8, 1910, Lindbloom was speeding thirty miles an hour in Cottage Avenue, and struck Joseph Weiss, a middle-aged cigar maker. He kept on but was compelled to stop after running two blocks because the body was tangled in the machinery.
