A box of Matches,

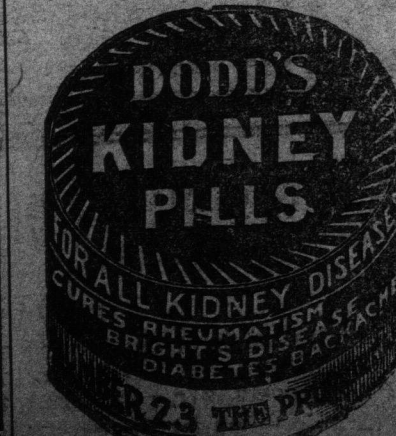
to remind them of home.

A list of subscribers will be sent with each shipment.

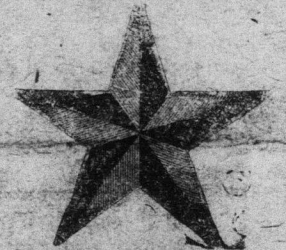
The Imperial Tobacco Company of St. John's will make out the parcels and the Government will waive the import duty and excise.
