Complains Against War Prices.

A local correspondent has sent a communication to the Telegram, protesting against the charges being made for Baker's loaves. He says the present charges are outrageous, as fourteen cents is being charged for a sixteen ounce loaf, in spite of the fact that flour costs the baker \$9.00 per barrel. He also complains that the shopkeepers are taking a profit of two cents on every loaf they sell, and he says it is high time these people dropped their excessive charges or give a reasonable explanation for not doing so. Complaints that war prices are still being charged in this city are frequently reaching us. Amongst those mentioned are the laundry proprietors, who are still asking 4 cents to do up a collar, in spite of the fact that soap and starch have declined about 50 per cent. The blacksmiths and milkmen have also come in for their share of criticism. They, too, evidently have not heard that the war is over.

S. S. Bassan Sold to Pay Wages.

Parrsboro, Dec. 9.—The former United States Shipping Board steamer Bassan, 1,528 tons register, which came here for repairs, has been sold at auction to Alder Fuglesy, River Herbert, for \$5,200. She was sold at sheriff's sale to pay wages of crew and other debts.

The Bassan's history for over a year has been a chapter of accidents. Bound from a United States port for Botwood, Nfld., with coal, she went ashore twice on the southern Newfoundland coast. She was finally towed to St. John's and after repairs started on another tow to an American port, only to go ashore at St. Pierre. She was subsequently taken to Halifax and thence to Parrsboro.

The Bassan had been purchased by St. Pierre parties after going ashore there.

Navigation Closed.

With the sailing of the tank steamer Crewe for New York to-day, Dec. 9th, the port of Montreal is clear of ocean-going vessels excepting those which are to tie up for the winter. The river St. Lawrence is still reported to be running free of ice at all points and the crew will have no difficulty in reaching their destination. Final departure of vessels for the sea takes place a few days later this year. Small river and lake boats are still moving and two of these are scheduled to discharge cargoes within the next few days and then proceed to the Canadian Vickers Company yards for overhauling.—Sydney Post.
