N.B.—It will be noted from the above net statement that no moneys whatsoever were received from the

Newfoundland Government or Municipal Council in financing Veterans' Week Celebrations, the necessary finance being obtained from entertainments and by voluntary contributions from the citizens of Newfoundland, principally of St. John's. The rifles, uniforms and equipments used by the Captain's Guard were purchased by the Newfoundland Government who still retain possession. All of the above money except the approximate sum of \$1000.00 Overseas transportation was spent in Newfoundland.

### Enormous Polar Bear Shot

A SLENDID SPECIMEN FOR OUR MUSEUM.

We have just seen a magnificent Polar Bear skin received from Labrador, which is to go forward for sale to Montreal next week. This skin is said by the Labrador-men to be the largest specimen of the White Bear ever captured on the coast. It measures 11ft. 9 in. long by 9ft. 1 in. in width. The hunters took special care to preserve this skin thoroughly, and have also the skull with teeth complete and the claws, so that there would be no difficulty in having this skin mounted.

We mention these facts, as it is a shame to let such a splendid specimen go out of the country, more especially as these White Bears are getting scarcer every year. The very fact of MacMillan stating last week, that after eighteen months in the Arctic regions he had not seen a single specimen of the White Bear would indicate that the species is becoming depleted. If the authorities intend to supplement the display of our animals in the Museum, we would strongly recommend them securing this skin at once.

For the past two years efforts have been made by the Marine & Fisheries Department to get the different sealers to bring in an assortment of young and old Harp and Hood seals, and other Marine Animals to supplement the display in the Museum. This is very much more difficult to accomplish than one would think, as the skins of these seals have to be preserved with the heads and claws complete, and should they become tainted they are worthless.

There have been many visitors to our Museum this summer all interested in our local marine animals, that it is a disappointment to them not to find a good display. It would be even more so next year when the tourist traffic is started.
