Plans of French **Expedition to North Pole**

PLAN TO USE AUTO SLEDGES.

PARIS. Nov. 17-The expedition t the North Pole planned by the French Navy Department for next spring, with a subsequent flight from the Pole to New York will depend heavily for its success upon the amphibious autosledges which are the recent invention of Otto Sverdrup, former Captain of the Polar ship Fram. They are said to be capable of carrying six tons at a speed over the ice of about 15 miles an hour, but their mechanical coustruction is being kept secret.

Flight to New York.

They are expected to carry two hydro-airplanes, sixteen men and the necessary supplies and scientific apparatus from King's Bay, Spitzbergen, to the North Pole, where the expedition will split, six men undertaking the New York flight, and the rest exploring the Polar regions with the auto-sledges.

Naval Commander Scales, chief of the expedition; Lieutenant Darois, wireless expert; Lieutenant De Bayser meteorologist, another pilot and two mechanicians to be chosen later, will undertake the flight, hoping to make Point Barrow, Alaska in ten hours. Gasoline supplies have already been purchased to care for the journey from Point Barrow southward. These will he stored at Nome and sent to Point Barrow around the first of July, when

he planes are expected to arrive. The aviators hope to reach New York in ten hops, proceeding by way of the MacKenzie River, Winnipeg and Chicago. The schedule calls for arriving in New York about August
