

HAMILTON ROLLING MILLS.—The Times says:—This industry, which employed so many men, and was the source of a large revenue to the merchants of this city, were formally closed on Saturday last at noon. The most of the workmen left the city by trains yesterday for different points in the United States. However, the Great Western Railway Company has taken the works in hand, and will soon again have the Mills running in the hurry and energy of business.

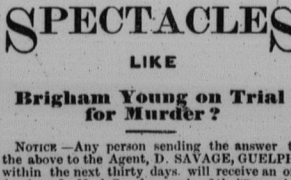
