"Merchandise can now be produced from imported material in blonded factaries. It seems to be safe and wise to carry the logic of this provision one step further, and have bonded or free ports, Suppose, instead of a bonded factory we bond awell defined section of land containing if you please several thousand acres. Within this bonded territory all kinds of factories could be built and into this zome all kinds of raw material could be entered without the payment of duty, This port should, of course, contain no dwellings. I would allow free coal and every other element of manufacture, except labor, to be entered free. In other words, this free port should be a great consumer of American labor, the product of which. under the most encouraging conditions, should be for import and export only. And if it were removed from the port for the purpose of domestic consumption, it should pay the same duty as if imported from abroad. I do not see where the American people could be harmed by such a policy and it would result in furnishing employment to those who choose to live beneath our flag, consume our products and work at the American scale of wag-

All New England would be benefitted by such a port somewhere on tffe North Atlantic coast. A similar port should be established in vicinity of Norfolk and another on the gulf.
