DAN M'GILLICUDDY DEAD AFTER LONG ILLNESS

Established the Goderich Signal, Brussels Post and Calgary News-Telegram.

Toronto, Dec. 12. — Daniel McGillle cuddy, a prominent Canadian newspaperman, died at his home, 727 Dovercourt road, last night, after an illness extending over two years and a half. He was in his 63rd year and for the past two years had lived in Toronto, coming here from Calgary, where he was publisher of the News-Telegram, giving it up on account of ill-health. He is survived by a widow, two sous and two daughters, all of Toronto. Mr. McGillicuddy was born in Carlisle, England, and came to Canada when quite young, settling in Halifax, where his father was connected with the British garrison. When a boy he entered newspaper work. Many years ago he established the Goderich Sig. nal and the Brussels Post, and later the Calgary News-Telegram. first position was on the Guelph Mercury. When a young man he was connected with the Globe during the time the late George Brown was editor, and when the Telegram was established by John Ross Robertson, over 30 years ago, he was taken on the editorial staff. He was also a past president of the Canadian Press Association. He was a veteran of the Fenian raid, going to the front in 1866 with the first Toronto contingent. When on the executive committee of the Canadian Wheelman's Association years ago, he was one of the first to begin the good roads movement, and he organized Huron County for the old Liberal Government. He took an active interest in politics, and had en-
