THE YALE ELECTION!

NEW WESTMINSTER, February 4.—Barnard arrived last night in a canoe with Stronach and Reynolds, the Expressman from Kootenay. I learn from the former that the United Company on Canadian Creek (not Conklus Gulch) have made a very rich strike in their hill tunnel, taking out three hundred ounces to one shift of timber. An interest was offered before the strike for two hundred dollars. A new and rich mining ground, it is supposed, has been found. The ground is staked for miles. This news came by a telegram to Yale.

River freezing. There was a great time at the Yale election. Teamsters turned out with sleighs, and fetched every elector within reach. Only six voters failed to poll. The abolition of road tolls was the only test question.

The good accounts from Kootenay given by Milby, are confirmed. A good deal of gold was taken out last season. More expected next; the miners are all doing well. Stronach's shafts in the canyon are down five (?) feet and the bed rock has not yet been reached; they expect to make a strike. Stronach left January 4th when everything was frozen up and mining stopped, but no snow. On Salmon mountain there were twenty feet of snow; on Hope mountain, eight feet. The party came by way of Colville, and travelled all the way on snow shoes and had a hard time.

Europe.

FALMOUTH, Jan. 13th.—The Isolana, from Liverpool for San Francisco, arrived, Jan. 9 in a disabled condition.

LONDON, Jan. 28th.—Mr Bennett, jr., offered the Henrietta as a New Year's gift to Prince Alfred, who respectfully declined.

The Empress Carlotta is completely restored in health.

King Maximilian, of Bavaria, will marry the sister of Francis Joseph of Austria.

LIVERPOOL, Jan. 29.—The Great Eastern was safely placed on the gridiron, at Birkenhead. On examination, it was found she was in good order, and she will sail for America on the 20th of March.

PARIS, Jan. 23.—It is said that Maximilian has issued a manifesto against the arrangements between the United States and France in regard to Mexico.

PARIS, Jan. 30.—The French man-of-war, Belliges, has sailed for the Pacific.

VIENNA, Jan. 29.—Breech-loading rifles have been given to a portion of the Austrians.

NEW YORK, Jan. 31.—The steamer from Liverpool on the 19th has arrived. The weather continued very severe throughout Europe. Travel was greatly impeded, and mails were behind. In some parts of Denmark the telegraph was buried in the snow.

The bullion in the Bank of England has decreased £158,000.

The Chilean loan proved a great success.

Mexico.

The French Consul, at Mexico, announces a free passage home to all French residents who desire to accompany the French army. A party of 800 Frenchmen have accordingly left.

NEW YORK, Jan. 29.—The Herald's Mexican advices say: The French authorities at Mazatlan executed Carman, the U. S. Consul; whereupon the U. S. gunboat bombarded the town for eight hours.

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 30.—An Imperial newspaper, dated City of Mexico, Jan. 19th,

says: Maximilian is at the City of Mexico arranging his private bureau. A new Congress has been called, to meet at Orizaba, but the result is uncertain. The anxiety of the people in view of the preparations for the departure of the French army increases daily. The last column, while returning from Guadalajara, repulsed the Liberals. Work has been commenced on the Imperial railroad.

Massacre on the Plains.

JUNCTION CITY, Feb. 2.—A man came into Salinas, 50 miles from here, yesterday, and reports a frightful massacre of white men by Cheyenne Indians, near the head of Smoky Hill river, a few days since, under the following circumstances:—A train with 60 men was in camp, when a party of 14 Indians came begging; the teamsters refused to give them anything, whereupon the Indians fired upon them without effect. The teamsters returned the fire and killed 8 Indians about eight o'clock that night the camp was surrounded by 200 Indians, who massacred 59 out of the 63 men. The man that brought the news had an arrow hole in his shoulder and another wound in the hip. He claims to be one of the four men who escaped.

Opening of Parliament!

THE QUEEN'S SPEECH!

THE PEOPLE CRY "REFORM!"

CHICAGO, Feb. 6.—The Queen's Speech at the opening of Parliament, yesterday, was yesterday transmitted over the cable. It contains about 250 words. The following are the most important parts:—"I have suggested to the Government of the United States a mode by which questions pending between the two countries, arising out of the civil war, may receive amicable solution, and which method, as I trust, will be received in a corresponding spirit, and remove all grounds of possible misunderstanding, and promote relations of cordial friendship. Your attention will again be called to the state of the representation of Parliament, and I trust your deliberations, conducted in a spirit of firmness and moderation and mutual forbearance, may lead to the adoption of measures which, without undue disturbance of balance of political power, shall finally extend the elective franchise.

LONDON, Feb. 5.—During the delivery of the Queen's address the people cried "Reform!" "Reform!"

BILLS PASSED.

Eastern States.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—Quite a sensation was created in the House yesterday by the appearance of Generals Grant and Sheridan, in whose honor the House suspended business. The Speaker welcomed Sheridan introducing each member personally.

NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—The President has stated that he would veto the tariff bill.

CHICAGO, Feb. 6.—The President gave the fifth State dinner last evening. It was intended to bring together the leading radicals of Congress and the Southerners. Half of the Radicals invited refused to attend.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—The Senate passed a joint resolution authorizing an ocean service of bi-monthly steamers between San Francisco and Portland with a subsidy of \$25,000 annually and the contract to be let to the lowest bidder.

NEW YORK, Jan. 31.—A correspondent of the St. Louis Democrat states that the directors of the Western Union Telegraph Company recently issued bonds bearing interest.

NEW YORK, Jan. 30.—A correspondent of a Boston paper says that Charles A. Dana will shortly commence the publication of the New York Daily Republican, an intensely radical paper; favoring the impeach-

ment of the President and the ballot for the negro. George Wilkes will be on the editorial staff.

NEW YORK, Jan. 29.—At the closing of sales of stocks yesterday there was another heavy decline and much excitement. A. J. Meyer, who overdrew his account at the Bank of North America, was expelled from the Board of Brokers.

The steamships Baltic and Atlantic will resume their trips to Europe, under a new American Steamship Company, between New York and Bremen.

Central America.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 3.—The Panama Chronicle, of Jan. 11th, states that the yellow fever has reached that place from Aspinwall where it was raging as an epidemic; but the same journal of 16th congratulates the public that the fever is not epidemic in Panama, and that the city is in usual health. On 11th the small-pox was at Aspinwall, and on the 10th there were three deaths in Panama from yellow fever. The Herald refers to the existence of cholera in Nicaragua, but not in exaggerated terms, as we were led to expect from the accounts previously published.

Congress had been summoned to an extraordinary session to meet on the 8th inst: for the purpose of celebrating an inter-oceanic railroad contract.

Cuba.

HAYANA, Jan. 26.—The gunboat Wyoniski and the revenue cutter Hugh McCulloch are still in the harbor. So far the Frederick Seward mission is a mystery. The report that the bay of Samana has been blockaded, is received with incredulity. Don Luis Arago (Mexican) has arrived en route for the United States on an Imperial mission.
