More Ministers Are Defeated

Two Members of Balfour's Late Cabinet Lose Their

London, Jan. 19—The election returns continue to show Liberal gains. Two more ministers were defeated today, william Bromley-Davenport, financial secretary to the war office for the Maclesfield division of Cheshire, and Sir Robert Finlay, attorney-general for Inverness, Scotland.

Another prominent Unionist, Sir Frederick Milne, was unseated in the Bassetlaw division of Nottinghamshire,
One of the most interesting features of today's election returns was the capture of West Belfast which has been a Unionist stronghold from time immemorial with the exception of a few years when the seat now won by Mr. Devlin has also been re-elected unopposed for North Kilkenny, but he will hold the Belfast seat. Among the candidates in today's elections is John Dillon, the Irish Nationalist.

The complete returns up to tonight follow: Liberals 228, Unionists 86, Nationalists 72, Laborites 37.

Mr. Devlin's victory at Belfast led to rather serious rioting in which many houses were partially wrecked.
