GERMANY ACCEPTS TERMS TO SIGN THURSDAY OR FRIDAY

Allies Refuse to Make Any Further Concessions—Move for Military Dictatorship in Germany Reported.

Weimar, June 23.—(By the Associated Press)—The National Assembly this afternoon voted to sign the peace terms unconditionally, the government having succeeded in overcoming the opposition of those who insisted on two conditions.

Although the Germans had pleaded for the striking out from the treaty of provisions acknowledging Germany's responsibility for the war, and calling for the trial of former Emperor William for a supreme offence against morality and the sanctity of treaties, the will of the Allies that these clauses remain in the document is to prevail.

Likewise a request for an extension of the time allowed for acknowledging the terms by the Germans of their willingness to meet the Allies terms—even though only forty-eight hours were asked for and the exigencies arising from the formation of a new government were pleaded as a basis—was promptly refused.

Not Signed Till Thursday.

Paris, June 23.—(By the Associated Press)—The signing of the peace treaty is not likely to take place before Thursday, possibly not until Friday. This announcement was made tonight by Premier Clemenceau and Secretary Dastous.

Paris, June 23.—(Havas)—The German note accepting the allied peace conditions without reservation made only typewritten copies. Paul Dastous, the secretary-general of the Peace Conference, had the note translated as soon as he received it and sent copies of the translation to Premier Clemenceau, Premier Lloyd George and President Wilson.

**SOME FIGHTER.**

Among the conscientious objectors to service in the American army was Alvan C. York, a tall, lanky, red-haired Tennessee mountaineer. His objections did not avail, however, and he was sent across, taking part in the Argonne forest fighting with the American troops who he personally killed one day, killed 22 Hung, captured 132 and destroyed 38 machine gun nests. Classed by Marshal Foch as the greatest hero of an army of the great war, wearing the French Croix de Guerre with palm and the American Congressional medal of honor, the recently promoted Lieut. Col. Alvan York is a pretty good example that a conscientious man can do some fighting when he has to, after all.

**PROTESTS AGAINST SENATE'S ACTION.**

Regina, Sask., June 23.—The Sask. athletic syndicate representing over 115,000 Presbyterians, have wired Ottawa protesting against the action of the Canadian Senate in nullifying the House of Commons.

**HEAVY ELECTRIC AND RAIL STORM VISITS SHEDJAC**

Moncton, June 22.—During a very heavy electric and rain storm at Shediac, Saturday afternoon, half the size of marbles fell, and some damage was done by lightning. While Garner, a six-year-old boy, was standing in the doorway at his home in Shediac town was struck by lightning and the shock torn from his feet. The lad was rendered unconscious for two hours and when restored was totally blind. Today, however, found Garner recovered to his sight. Buildings were struck in different parts of the surrounding country.

**MAY SAVE THE GERMAN WARSHIPS.**

London, June 24.—Three of the German warships which they attempted to sink at Scapa Flow, Saturday, have been beached, and the Bude is moored in readiness for beaching. There is every prospect of salvaging the ship in good condition if the necessary apparatus arrives before bad weather sets in. The ships beached are the cruisers Emden, Frankfurt and Nürnberg.

PRINCE OF WALES TO VISIT N. B. EARLY IN AUGUST

Premier Foster Makes Announcement on Return From Ottawa.

St. John N. B., June 23.—That H. R. H. the prince of Wales, is coming to New Brunswick, probably early in August, was one of the announcements made by Premier Foster on his return from Ottawa Sunday.

Hon. Mr. Foster and Mr. Foster went first to Toronto where on Tuesday last they attended the closing exercises at Haverhill Ladies' College, at which institution their daughter, Miss Jean M. Foster, has been in attendance. She won the gold medal for general efficiency, and at the closing it was presented to her by Hon. Mr. McPherson, provincial secretary of Ontario.

While in Toronto Premier Foster looked thoroughly into the Ontario government's system of wholesale and retail vendlings for liquor. The entire sale is handled by the province, the head official being a man who formerly was manager for a wholesale liquor importing firm in Hamilton.

Hon. Mr. McPherson, Provincial Secretary, and Mr. Flavell, chairman of the government commission, gave Hon. Mr. Foster complete details of the system, by which all sales and all control are a part of the hands of private parties. The Premier expects the Ontario plan will be introduced in New Brunswick during the coming autumn.

In Ottawa, Hon. Mr. Foster conferred with Hon. Mr. Carvell regarding the Valley Railway being taken over by the Dominion government, but it appears that the cabinet is not likely to any action at present or under present conditions. The Premier had a talk with Hon. Mr. Reid in connection with federal aid to the provinces for roads. There is still a chance that the assistance will be given.

Among the visitors to the capital while Premier Foster was there was Hon. Mr. Stewart Premier of Alberta, who said a large and representative delegation from the Prairie provinces was to be present at the national Liberal convention at Ottawa in August.

Premier Foster, as the New Brunswick member of the national committee is arranging details of the campaign. New Brunswick constituencies to choose delegates to the national convention will be held very soon.
