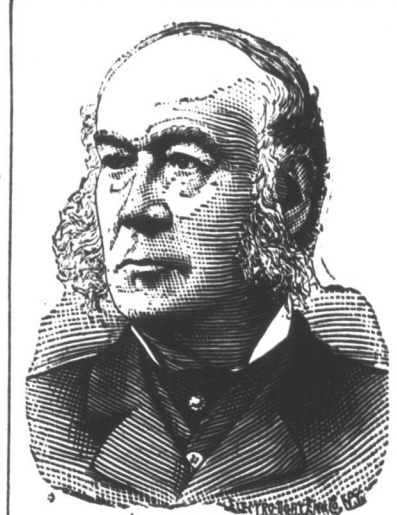

York's Representative in the House of Commons.
