Brutality in the German Army,
In the German Reichstag during the debate on the war budget Herr Richter and Herr Hinze called attention to the numerous cases of suicide in the army. It was shown that the cases were increasing every year, and Herr Richter boldy declared that the cause of the evil was the brutality of the officers toward the soldiers, especially toward the recruits. Gen. Spitz said that the suicides which occurred among the treops stationed in provinces specially referred to were not more numerous than the cases of suicides among civilians in the same provinces in which the soldiers, were recruited. The thing had no connection whatever with the rigor of the military system nor with the abuses which certain individuals from time to time were goilty of. Herr Richter said that the brutal treatment of the officers and the difficulty of obtaining justice drove the soldiers to suicide. He insisted that an inquiry should be made into all those cases, and that the bodies should be handed over for examination to medical men unconnected with the army.
