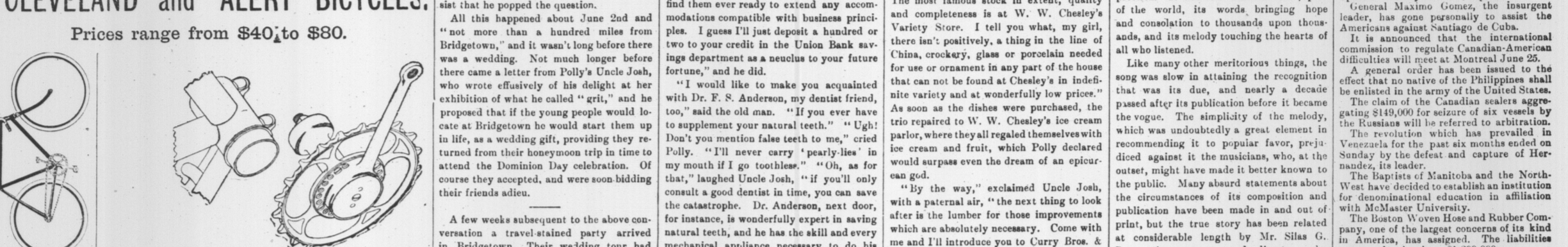

History of a Well-Known Song. The recent death of Dr. Samuel Fillmore Bennett, of Richmond, Ill., who wrote the words of "The Sweet Bye and Bye," has reawakened interest in a song that for years was one of the most popular—if that word may be used in this connection—of religious musical compositions.

Like many other meritorious things, the song was slow in attaining the recognition that was its due, and nearly a decade passed after its publication before it became the vogue. The simplicity of the melody, which was undoubtedly a great element in recommending it to popular favor, and the earnest, might have made it better known to the public.
