

Illustration No. 5 shows the interior of the c'tadel plateau, looking over the St. Charles valley, with part of the Laurentian range in the distance, as seen from the Governor-General's windows.

-The present citadel was built in the early part of this century. The old French fortifications extended rather farther than the present works, and their lines can be most distinctly traced. Large military stores are kept in the citadel.

Illustration No. 6 (facing page 217) is Wolfe's Cove, now filled with timber stores belonging to the lumber merchants. Under the steep cliffs are picturesque small villages along the riverside, inhabited mostly by lumbermen and fishermen. The road passing through these villages, having on the one side the great river, and on the other the dcep-eaved houses, is one of the prettiest in the immediate neighbourhood of Quebec.
