

## DOGS.

It is ordered,

40. That any person who shall be bitten or attacked by any Dog within the limits of the said city or banlieue, shall be at liberty to apply to His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for this district, at any weekly Sessions, for redress against the owner of such dog, or other person under whose care or superintendence such dog may have been at the time, and in such case, or in case it shall be otherwise proved before the said Justices, that any person does keep a notoriously vicious dog, such Justices in such weekly Sessions, shall thereupon make such order thereon, as shall be just, both with regard to any pecuniary damages not exceeding forty shillings, currency, as they may think proper to award against such owner in favor of any person, so bitten or attacked, as with regard to the killing or shutting up such dog.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING  
APPRENTICE, &c.

It is ordered,

1. That if any indented apprentice, servant or Journeyman, who may be bound by Indenture, or other written contract, for a longer time than one month, or by verbal agreement for one month, or any shorter period, shall be guilty of any misconduct or absenting himself without leave, or dissipating his master, mistress or employer's effects, such apprentice, servant or journeyman may, upon complaint and due proof thereof made before the Justices of the Peace in their weekly or special sittings, be sentenced to be committed to the House of Correction, at hard labour for any time according to the circumstances of each and every offence not exceeding two months : or may, be sentenced to pay for each offence, a fine not exceeding ten pounds, currency.

2. That if any such apprentice, servant or journeyman, bound and engaged as aforesaid, has any just cause of complaint against his or her master or em-
