CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

It is not possible to chronicle an actual advance in prices of white pine, but from the standpoint of the manufacturer such a circumstance has transpired. By this statement is meant that the prices which the manufacturers have established as the basis on which to sell the 1903 production represent an advance on what was figured upon one month ago. These prices have not met the views of the buyers. Some are acceding to the demands of the manufacturers and contracting for their season's supply as nearly as it can be estimated, others are holding back and watching the situation with great interest. The situation is an interesting one, but it seems that the manufacturers hold the whip hand, particularly as their action is justified in a large measure by the increased cost of producing lumber. The average asking price of log run pine is perhaps about \$20; for a specially fine lot of logs as high as \$22 has been asked, but we have heard of no sales at that figure. The American buyers are an aggressive factor in the white pine market, and the competition thus engendered makes the position of the manufacturer a comparatively easy one.

The movement of hardwoods is large considering the supply and the season of the year. Dealers and consumers are anxious to increase their stocks and to arrange for a reasonable supply for the spring and summer, but it has been found difficult to make much headway in that direction. Higher prices are predicted before spring.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

There is a strong demand in the Eastern Provinces for all classes of timber and lumber. Our Quebec list this week has been advanced to correspond with the general appreciation in the value of square and waney timber. Doubtless the present winter a production will pass from the producer to the shipper at prices heretofore unheard of. Spruce deals are in steady inquiry. For delivery at St. John \$15 per
