#### **24. Hunting and Fishing Licences**

In Ontario and Quebec, diplomatic and consular officers and their eligible dependents may be issued free hunting and fishing licences on application to the Office of Protocol of the Department of External Affairs and the provincial office of protocol respectively.

#### **25. Privileges and Benefits for Members of Diplomatic and Consular Administrative and Technical and Service Staff**

##### **25.1. Importation of Articles for Personal Use**

Members of diplomatic and consular administrative and technical and service staff may import articles, except spirits, wine, and beer, for their personal use or the personal use of their dependents free of customs duties, taxes, and related charges other than for storage, cartage, and similar services only during the period of first installation. This period is generally considered to be within six months after first arrival in Canada. See section 19.

##### **25.2. Resale of Automobiles**

With some exceptions based on reciprocity, automobiles imported into, or purchased in, Canada must be retained by members of diplomatic and consular administrative and technical and service staff for a period of at least two years before they may be resold free of federal customs duties and taxes. The minimal period of two years is calculated from the date of delivery of the automobiles to the applicants in Canada. It is not possible for the Office of Protocol of the Department of External Affairs to consider the resale of automobiles before the minimal period of two years.
