(5) The present Agreement shall be subject to review by the two Governments at any time following acceptance by both Governments of a future multilateral instrument in the form of guidelines, principles or agreements dealing with the same substantive matters.

If these proposals meet with the approval of the Government of the United States, I have the honour further to propose that this Note, which is equally authentic in English and French, and your reply to that effect, shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments to extend the Agreement constituted by the Exchange of Notes of May 14, 1971, for a period of five years commencing on May 14, 1975, and to amend it by adding the additional provisions stipulated hereinabove, and to propose that this Agreement enter into force on the date of your reply with effect from May 14, 1975 as far as the extension of the earlier Agreement is concerned. It is understood that the present Agreement may be terminated by either Government upon six months' notice to the other, or extended further by the mutual agreement of the two Governments.

Please accept, Sir, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
