B. A. degree in 1936. From 1936 to 1942 he was engaged in the journalistic field in Canada as a member of the editorial staff of the "Edmonton Journal" and of the "Vancouver Daily Province"; in the United Kingdom with the "Evening News" of Leeds and the "Times" of London; and in Australia with the "Melbourne Argus" and "Sydney Sun". During this period he was awarded a Commonwealth Press Union Exchange Fellowship.

During World War II, Mr. Malone was representative of the Wartime Information Board (later the Canadian Information Service) in Canberra.

Mr. Malone joined the Department of External Affairs in July 1946 and saw service abroad in Canberra, in Washington and in The Hague. In 1962 Mr. Malone became Canadian Ambassador to Iran and since June 1967 has been High Commissioner to Nigeria and Sierra Leone and Ambassador to Dahomey.

ALLAN SYDNEY MCGILL

Mr. McGill was born in Smithers, B. C. on February 1, 1922. In 1941 he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force with which he served in Normandy and in Germany as flight controller; he was dischared in 1945 as a Flight Lieutenant.

At the end of hostilities Mr. McGill attended the University of British Columbia until his graduation in 1948 when he joined the Department of External Affairs. He has served abroad with the Department in Pretoria (1950), New Delhi (1957) and Tokyo (1962). In August 1965 he was named Canadian High Commissioner to Tanzania. During his various tours of duty in Ottawa, he was Executive Assistant to the Secretary of State for External Affairs (1955), Executive Assistant to the Director General of the External Aid Office (1960) and, since his return from Dar-es-Salaam in 1967, has been the Department's Senior Assistant to the Secretary of State for External Affairs.

Mr. McGill is married to Jessie Smith Hunter and they have three children.

DONALD SUTHERLAND MCPHAIL

Mr. McPhail was born in Halifax on May 26, 1931.

He attended the University of New Brunswick from which he received a.B. A. and an M. A. He also studied at the University of The Netherlands in Leyden and at the London School of Economics.
