Sir,

I am desired by the Council of the Royal Society of Arts to ask you if you will allow your name to be added to the list of its supporters.

The Society, which was founded in 1754, has for more than a century and a half held the foremost position among the Societies whose object is the development of the industrial, commercial, and artistic resources of the Empire.
