once on this area, now would it be just to say to this bona fide Limit Holder you shall immediately see those four ranges taken out of your limit, and if you wish to save your wood you have only till the first day of May to do so? I think, Mr. Speaker, that it would not be giving justice to the Limit Holder to sell immediately out of his limit four or six ranges in order to create a reserve, without giving him a certain time during which he shall have the right to take off his wood. Now,how long should we give him? In the special report made by the late Hon. G. W. Stephens, one of the original Commissioners appointed by this Government on the commission of colonization, he recommends that one year at least should be given to the Limit Holder, and I might say that I consider the delay suggested by the Hon. Mr. Stephens only right and just. That is to say, once a reserve would be decided upon, the Limit Holder should be notified that a reserve has been created; that roads will be made at once in this reserve, and that in one year's time he will have no more right on these lots and that they will be taken out of
