SUBMARINE'S FEAT SENT WHEAT DOWN

Chicago Disposed to Look for Early Opening of Dar-

TWO CENT DECLINE

Corn Weaker on Prospects of Bumper Crop-Oats Steady.

CHICAGO, May 13.—Uncertainties regarding the diplomatic outlook as to the latest war development had a depressing effect today in the wheat market here. The close was heavy at 2c to 2 3-8c under last night. Corn declined 3-4c to 1 1-8c net and oats 3-8c to 5-8c. In provisions the final results varied from a drop of 10c to 5c advance.

The sharpest setbacks for wheat came just before the end of the session when the news was out that a British submarine had forced the Dardanelles and had sunk Turkish was craft in the Sea of Marmora. The exploit was looked on as indicating more rapid progress than had been recently looked for in the direction of opening a way for shipments of wheat from Russia. On the other hand, prices made little, if any, response to announcements that another British battleship had been torpedoed by the Turks.

Exports Temporarily Curbed.

Temporary blocking of export business formed a source of disquiet that previous to the Dardanelles news had steatly increased the selling pressure today on wheat. Possibilities growing out of the American note to Germany were said to be hindering foreign transactions for the time being, and there were also reports that from other causes ocean freight rates were advancing in a manner that made contracts for new crop shipments hazardous. Efforts to cancel such contracts received a good deal of attention. Hessian fly crop damage advices were renewed, but purchase orders influenced thereby seemed to have notably diminished in volume.

Corn declined with wheat and as a result of bearish Argentine reports and of favorable domestic planting conditions. Oats showed relative strength compared with other cereals. Rumors of export business in oats. however, were not confirmed.

Provisions were unsettled and irregular thruout the session. Higher prices for hogs tended to have a strengthening effect, but were more or less offset by the weakness of grain.
