

**T**HE opening of the New Wing of Wycliffe College completes for the present a work which has had a very remarkable history during the past thirty years.

1877        In October, 1877, the late Principal, the Reverend Dr. Sheraton, met the first four or five students in the Infant Class Room of St. James' School house, and with the voluntary assistance of several well known Parochial Clergymen began his work, the work of the College.

1882        The first College Building was erected on the North side of College St. in proximity to the University of Toronto with which Institution from the first it was affiliated.

1885        This Building was enlarged by the erection of a Library and additional rooms for students.

1891        The work of the College was transferred to its new home on Hoskin Avenue where a spacious building, then supposed to answer all the purposes of the Institution, was erected.
