AGCLAIM BY FRANCE
OF U. S. PRESIDENT
MARKS PRECEDENT
Landing at Brest Was First Entry of American Head Into Affairs of Europe.
A NOTABLE PAGEANT
President Receives Address of Welcome, and Leaves for Paris Amid Cheers.

Brest, Dec. 13.—President Wilson landed in France at 3:24 o'clock this afternoon, amid a demonstration of popular enthusiasm and national sympathy. The president left Brest at four o'clock this afternoon for Paris, where the heart of France will acclaim him tomorrow as the nation's guest.

HEAVY VOTE WILL FAVOR GOVERNMENT

London, Dec. 13.—The vote in the British elections will not be counted until Dec. 28, and until that date all statements about the result will be surmises. The British custom is to collect all votes at a central point in each constituency and count them. This time it will be necessary to await the arrival of the soldier-ballet from overseas. In the interval the ballot boxes will be in charge of the police.
