# NEW YORK BANK HUNTING FOR MISSING MESSENGER

New York, March 11.-William O. Gillespie, a messenger of the National bank's funds also disappeared. It was to-day in this announcement: "William O. Gillespie, 25 years old,

a messenger in the employ of the National Park Bank for about six months, failed to return last Tuesday afternoon, after making his customary collections. He ... collected between \$1600 and \$1700 and no trace of him has been found."

Gillespie is said to be a native of Scotland, who came to the bank from Canada about six months ago. His duties were to make collections on notes and drafts sent in by the corre-spondents of the bank. He lived at a boarding-house on East 89th-street. Last Tuesday afternoon he is said to have gone to his rooms, where was joined by another young man wi whom he had been friendly. The two men left the house together and on the




