Wholesale trade at Toronto continues the wholesale trade at Toronto some menchants, and until the enext two weeks, general business is likely to slacken. Stock taking is engaging the attention of some menchants, and until the end of the year it will be pretty general. Heavy lines of dry goods, furs, etc., are in moderate demand. Groceries fairly active, with dry fruits selling freely. Prices all round are firm, and payments are very encouraging. Sugars are a fraction higher. The number of full-ures keeps smail, and the feeling generally its one of confidence. There is still a large export demand for grain, chiefly wheat and loats. Shippers are very busy, and there seems to be little let-up to cable orders. Money is in good demand, but rates remain-unchanged. Many of our banks are employing their surplus funds in large United States cities, where the demand for money is brisk. Prime commercial paper is discounted in Toronto at 6 per cent. And call loans are quoted at 4 per cent. New York drafts are firmer than for some time. The Bank of England discount rate is unschanged at 3 per cent, and the open market rates are firm at 2 15-16 to 3 per cent. Canadian stocks are fairly active and strong as a rule.
